# **Treatment PPE Breach and Treatment Staff Exposure**

This protocol covers the doffing of PPE and clothing in the event that a breach in PPE occurs.

## **Roles and Responsibilities**

- Caregiver responsible for patient care.
- Coach responsible for assisting the removal of PPE, performing spot decon, and identifying potential breaks in PPE.
- Observer responsible for observing the doffing process, and records all steps to ensure properly followed. Should not assist/touch the caregiver, contaminated PPE, or the coach.

Should there be a breach in PPE protocol, the following steps should be followed:

- 1. Remove all PPE per Treatment PPE protocol
- 2. Remove all clothing and place into waste same as PPE
- 3. Preform hand hygiene and spot decon with 1:10 dilution of bleach to the exposed area.
- 4. Provide care giver with a patient gown
- 5. Take care giver to a shower, if available
- 6. Follow normal guidance to monitor employee exposures per Treatment PPE protocol

## **Types of exposures to Ebola patient:**

- Blood or body fluid contact with broken skin, eyes, nose, mouth, other mucous membranes.
- Percutaneous injury with known or potentially contaminated sharp.
- Contact with blood or body fluid over an area of apparently intact skin.
- Examples include: lacerations, puncture wounds, mucous membrane exposures.

### If an exposure occurs:

- 1. Immediately notify the "observer" of injury and they will notify they will notify the charge nurse, Employee Health Director (979-574-3072), Safe Choice case manager and Infection Prevention Control practitioner.
- 2. Immediately exit the room. Use Treatment PPE protocol.
- 3. Exit to the shower, if available, where observer will assist.
- 4. Initiate first aid.
- 5. Wash contaminated skin and wounds thoroughly with chlorhexidine and water for a minimum of 20 minutes. Massage deep wounds gently.
- 6. If the exposure is to the eye, mouth, or nose, irrigate with water or sterile saline solution for a minimum of 20 minutes. Use eyewash station if indicated. **DO NOT use betadine or chlorhexidine scrub in or near the eye**.
- 7. Apply a bandage if needed.
- 8. Continue normal exit procedures and immediately report to Employee Health (CTX locations) NTX locations report to the Emergency Department. After hours CTX and NTX locations report to the Emergency Department.
- 9. Follow the appropriate documentation process for employee exposure.
