


STUDY DESIGN


- Baseline data from Watch the Spot trial
- Survey of 2,049 patients 6 to 8 weeks after diagnosis of new lung nodule



RESULTS



Greater distress was associated with:



In patients with recently diagnosed pulmonary nodules, almost one-half of respondents experienced some degree of emotional distress, with highest distress associated with larger nodule size, lack of timely notification by a clinician, younger age, female sex, ever smoking, Black race, and Hispanic ethnicity.
